I. The meeting was called to order at 7:20 pm.

II. Opening Prayer by Carolyn Ginyard (PTFA Co-President)

III. Review of September to December School activities

Jeannetta Daniels (PTFA co-president) discussed the first half of the school year PTFA activities.

- (i) Harvest Dance K-5 was a success 35 to 40 students attended. The event was a social success. The cost of the event was approximately \$140.00 with the monies
- (ii) Trinity Church Fall Harvest – the PTFA provided its annual booth and sold Candy pixie sticks and crafts. The PTFA's participation is good will toward the church and all proceeds is by the Church.
- (iii) K-5 Movie Night – was a social success 20 to 25 students with their family attended. Chicken fingers and French fries were sold. It was suggested that the movie night is open to the ECC students.
- (iv) Barnes and Noble School Night Out- was a success we earned approximately \$323.00 dollars from Trinity family purchases.
- (v) Pizza Fridays – has been receiving volunteers and provides between \$80.00 to \$100.00 a week after the cost of the pizza pies.
- (vi) Santa Shop – this year's Santa Shop earned \$1,724.83
- (vii) Robotics Lab – Mr. Stanikamp is fully in with the lab. But this year the school will not be participating in the FLL competition. However, the school plans on competing next year possibly as an after-school team.

IV. Treasurer's Report

Carolina Jones (PTFA Treasurer) – explained that as of date there is \$ 23,452.00 in the account. She explained that the PTFA is responsible for some monthly expenses and provides a yearly teacher supply credit of \$250.00 per full time teacher. The PTFA also provides the water in the teacher's lounge.

Pop-Up Valentine Shop

Carolina Jones discussed that the PTFA is having a Pop Up Valentine Shop – On Thursday and Friday February 9th and 10th. PTFA will sell items during the students' lunch hours. ECC will have

reserved times to come and shop. The items are valentine items – pens, cups, keychains etc. with a cost range of \$1.00 to \$10.00.

Middle School Red Heart Dance

Carolyn Ginyard discussed the return of the Middle School Red Heart Dance that is on Friday February 17 for all the middle school students. The cost will be \$10.00 per student and will consist of a DJ and a photo booth. Carmen Barbosa (PTFA Social Media Liaison) volunteered to manage the photo booth.

Scholastic Book Fair

Carolyn Ginyard also discussed the Scholastic Book Fair that will be held on March 13th to 15th. She explained that it is managed like the Santa Shop but indicated that a chairperson is needed but she will attend the required training.

Wingo

Jeannetta Daniels discussed that this year's WINGO will be held on Friday April 7th.** She emphasized the need for parents to donate unwanted gifts. Mrs. Daniels discussed "big ticket" items the PTFA would purchase for the grand items. The class contribution baskets were discussed and different ways to ensure each student contributes to the class basket.
